Orientation to Interns

The program commenced at 10 am in the morning with the intern in-charge Dr. Krishna kant welcoming the new batch of interns and giving a brief introduction of how the six month compulsory rotatory postings will be carried out and how the log book should be maintained along with the seminars, case presentation and the project work that needs to be completed in order to finish the internship program.

Following him, Dr. Lata parmar, principal college of physiotherapy, shared her experience of clinical practice. She also spoke on how the students can utilize the guidance of faculties and the facilities available in order to gain maximum knowledge and skills in these 6 months.

Dr. Kumar talked about finding out an area of interest and mastering skills which could later help the student choose the specialty for further studies, whereas Dr. Kalpesh focused more on explaining the rules and regulation, and how to maintain discipline in wards as well as in OPD. At the end Dr. Megha concluded by encouraging the students to put their maximum effort and go out as a good physiotherapist.

Awareness program on Pharmaco vigilance for Physiotherapists

On October 7, 2014 at 10.00 am, Department Pharmacology conducted an Awareness program on Pharmaco vigilance for Physiotherapists. The program was held at Physiotherapy Education Unit and Physiotherapy faculty were present to attend the program.

At the outset, Dr B. Sattigeri, HOD of Department of Pharmacology, explained the need of this awareness program as Physiotherapists. As a health care provider, Physiotherapists will get a chance to interact with patients and may notice any potential undesirable effect that may arise due to any drug consumed by the patient so it is essential for them to be aware about Pharmaco vigilance and the procedures involved in reporting the same. She also informed that the Pharmacology department has initiated this effort and the awareness program for Physiotherapists was the first of all that had been planned for Sumandeep Vidyapeeth campus. She thanked Principal Prof Lata Parmar for supporting this venture.



Dr Nirav Patel, Assistant Professor from Pharmacology, conducted the Orientation program and during his lecture he explained what is Pharmaco vigilance, the definition of adverse effect and adverse events. He described a real scenario that took place some years before in Dhiraj Hospital in which Pharmaco vigilance played an important role in identifying the problem. He used this scenario to explain the importance of Pharmaco vigilance in health care services. He further explained about the procedures involved in identifying and reporting an adverse effect. If a Physiotherapist suspects any adverse effect of a drug in any patient he / she can call the Pharmacology department and Department of Pharmacology will readily respond to such reports by providing copies of forms to be filled up for reporting and also will help in filling up the forms. He said it benefit immensely to both the patient and hospital.

At the end of program question and answer session was held where Physiotherapy faculty asked their doubts while reporting and Dr Sattigiri and Nirav Patel answered them. Finally Dr Sattigiri again thanked Physiotherapy Principal Prof Lata Parmar for her immense help in organizing the program.
